"Turning recession into opportunity – the key is innovation" The 2012 IEF travels to Armenia

As with previous events, the forum will showcase a number of industry luminaries, who have already committed to address delegates at the event. The forum will be opened by the Prime Minister of The Republic of Armenia and will be supported by the Minister of Economy of The Republic of Armenia. In addition other confirmed speakers include Mojy Chian, Senior VP Design Enablement, GlobalFoundries and Joe Sawicki, VP & GM Design To Silicon, at Mentor Graphics.

The forum will be held at the Marriott Hotel, Yerevan, Armenia between the 3-5 October 2012 and is set to attract C-Level industry executives from all over the world for a 2-day period of industry keynotes and interactive debate. The event pans the full industry food chain, from the advanced scientific research labs to the end markets and service providers, ensuring all aspects of the industry are addressed.
