Kurfurstenschanke - Tea & Cakes



The Kurfürstenhof has been open since December 2006 in the newly built Quartier II. The building known earlier as "Zur Glocke" – by the bell, is situated directly by the Frauenkirche – Church of our Lady.

The absolute highlight of the house is a perfect replica of the world famous Mohr from the "Grüne Gewölbe" – green vault, made from Dresden porcelain. Fascinating hand – painted large pictures among the works of Jean Francois de Troy can be found on the end wall of the ground floor. The walls are decorated in fine wood from which the carved heads of the regents of Wettin majestically gaze, among them, of course, is August the Strong.
